



The mission of the Family Medicine Residency Program is to train family medicine physicians and community leaders who are equipped to provide exceptional full-spectrum, team-based care for diverse rural and underserved communities.

**Our program offers:**

- Real-world experience in a medical center with a community focus.
- Comprehensive training at family medicine clinics with a diverse patient panel.
- Experience caring for newborns to elderly patients with a wide range of health conditions.
- Opportunities to learn from OHSU’s world-class family medicine faculty.

**Why Choose Hillsboro Medical Center?**

Our residents receive their training at one of two Family Medicine Practices and provide inpatient care, including deliveries, at Hillsboro Medical Center in Hillsboro. Our residents learn from a core group of experienced family medicine faculty who collectively bring a broad range of skills, experiences in rural and underserved communities, and fellowship training in advanced maternity care, geriatrics, and sports medicine to Hillsboro Medical Center.

**A unique experience**

The unique setting of a regional medical center located in the community provides residents with a supportive educational environment. Hillsboro Medical Center is a not-for-profit health care system with a hospital that has 215 licensed beds and state-of-the-art acute care services.

Hillsboro Medical Center is affiliated with OHSU, the only academic health center in Oregon. The residency program is part of OHSU’s nationally recognized Department of Family Medicine, which provides residents with access to OHSU’s state-of-the-art learning, opportunities for scholarships, and a referral network.

**Our Program**

The OHSU Hillsboro Family Medicine Residency Program uses a modified “2 + 2” schedule that allows residents to complete most rotations in two[1]week segments, with most alternating between outpatient and inpatient experiences. Residents are assigned a family medicine faculty advisor who is paired with them on a clinical team at one of the following Hillsboro clinics:  
South Hillsboro Primary Care • Orenco Station Primary Care

Residents will follow a diverse panel of patients and will:

- Provide wellness care for patients of all ages and care for a wide variety of acute and chronic medical conditions.
- Receive procedural training, including gynecologic, obstetric, musculoskeletal, and dermatologic procedures, including Point of Care Ultrasound (POCUS).
- Learn about panel management and the Patient-Centered Medical Home by attending monthly clinic meetings with clinic staff.
- Incorporate behavioral health education that focuses on motivational interviewing and screening, brief intervention, referral to treatment (SBIRT), and includes training in office-based addiction treatment (OBAT)



OHSU Family Medicine Residency, Portland, is a 4-year academic program based in Portland, Oregon. We are part of FM-AIRE (Advancing Innovation in Residency Education), striving to broadly train residents to become leaders who provide full-spectrum care to meet the needs of the communities they serve.

Ours is a rigorous program that allows for significant modifiable time, primarily in the 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> years. With this modifiable time, residents can choose from pre-existing educational experiences or craft new ones, allowing them to explore and deepen skill sets in areas of passion and interest, and ultimately, to be excellently trained generalists well prepared for practice outside of residency.

FM-AIRE has additionally enabled us to offer residents the option to use their modifiable time to gain fellowship experience integrated across their 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> years. Currently, fellowship opportunities exist in Sports Medicine, Hospice and Palliative Medicine, OB, and Leadership. Those completing interleaved Sports Medicine and HPM fellowships are eligible to sit for their CAQ (Certificate of Added Qualification). As we pilot this novel training model, we hope that it facilitates the development of niche skills in providers who will still practice comprehensive primary care outside of training.

We are a RHEDI-certified program and have faculty expertise in a wide array of areas: Comprehensive Family Medicine, FM-OB with multiple Family Medicine-trained faculty practicing surgical obstetrics, Reproductive Health, Sports Medicine, POCUS, Lifestyle Medicine, Gender Affirming Care, Addiction Medicine, and Relational Leadership.

Our primary hospital is in SW Portland, and we offer 4 continuity clinic sites:

South Waterfront Clinic set in SW Portland • Gabriel Park Clinic set in SW Portland • Richmond Clinic, a Federally Qualified Health Center, set in SE Portland • Scappoose Clinic, a Rural Health Center, set 25 minutes outside Portland in Columbia County


In addition, our residents rotate through a variety of other locations within Oregon, including but not limited to: Legacy Emanuel in NE Portland, Kaiser Westside in Hillsboro, and a 4–6 week rotation in Enterprise (a rural community in the NE corner of the state, about 6 hours from Portland).

## **Overview**

The opportunities for residents training within the OHSU Three Sisters Rural Track Program will be centered within a rich family medicine community and a vibrant, culturally diverse, rural population in Central Oregon. Residents will spend their first year in Portland, followed by two years in Central Oregon. In partnership with St. Charles Health System, this program brings together educational teams within various clinical models to help meet the needs of rural parts of the state.

St. Charles Health System is the only hospital system in Central Oregon with an expansive geographic area consisting of Deschutes, Crook, and Jefferson counties. Currently, the system operates two critical access hospitals — one located in Madras (Jefferson County) and one in Prineville (Crook County).

This is the first Graduate Medical Education Program and Rural Track Program in Central Oregon. As a 1-2 program, this residency will recruit up to three residents per class.







### **Resident Eligibility and Selection Criteria**

Applicants must be graduates of medical schools in the United States and Canada accredited by the Liaison Committee on Medical Education (LCME), colleges of Osteopathic medicine in the US accredited by the American Osteopathic Association (AOA), OR graduates of medical schools outside the United States and Canada who meet one of the following qualifications:

- Have received a currently valid certificate from ECFMG prior to appointment, or
- Have a full and unrestricted license to practice medicine in a US licensing jurisdiction in which they are training
- Applicants must be eligible to be licensed in the State of Oregon
- Applicants must have passed USMLE or COMLEX Part I and Part II
- Applicants should be proficient in Medical Spanish and be able to care for patients in most settings without an interpreter by the beginning of their second year of the program
- Unfortunately, we are unable to consider applicants who have graduated from medical school more than 3 years prior to their application date.


International medical graduates must have a valid ECFMG certification, U.S. citizenship, or permanent resident status. Providence Health & Services and Providence Hood River Family Medicine Rural Program do sponsor J-1 visas on a case-by-case basis when all other criteria is met. In addition, applicants should have demonstrable inpatient experience and credible recommendations from an ACGME-accredited teaching hospital within the last five years. Applicants must speak fluent English, though other language skills can be an asset. Passage of the 'English Proficiency' test for the ECFMG does not assure this level of competency.

Providence Health & Services - Portland Service Area will ensure that its ACGME-accredited programs select from among eligible applicants on the basis of their preparedness, ability, aptitude, academic credentials, communication skills, and personal qualities such as motivation and integrity. ACGME-accredited programs in the Portland Service Area will not discriminate with regard to sex, race, age, religion, color, national origin, disability, or veteran status.

Applications are accepted exclusively through ERAS. We welcome qualified graduates from both allopathic and osteopathic programs, as Providence Oregon Family Medicine Residency participates in the National Resident Matching Program.

**Required Documents for ERAS Application:**

- Dean's Letter
- Personal Statement
- Official Medical School Transcripts
- Letters of Reference (3 or more)

**Exam Requirements:**

- Passing scores on USMLE STEP 1 and COMLEX 1, with a maximum of one fail.
- Recommended passing scores on USMLE STEP 2 and COMLEX 2, with no failing scores, in order to be ranked.

Information for D.O. Applicants: We welcome D.O. candidates and accept COMLEX scores without requiring USMLE scores. As a resident, you may practice gentle OMM techniques with clinic patients, although high-velocity maneuvers are not permitted. We currently do not have a D.O. faculty member to teach or bill for OMM. Previous D.O. residents have maintained their OMM skills by collaborating with local D.O.s during electives or attending CME conference workshops.



**Other Requirements:**

- Demonstrable inpatient experience and credible recommendations from an ACGME-accredited teaching hospital.
- Fluency in English is required, though other language skills can be an asset. Passing the 'English Proficiency' test for ECFMG does not assure this level of competency.
- International medical graduates must have both a valid ECFMG certification and U.S. citizenship or permanent resident status.
- Graduation from medical school must have occurred within the past 3 years.
- Visas are not sponsored by Providence Oregon FMR.

Selection Process: Providence Health & Services -- Portland Service Area ensures that its ACGME-accredited programs select applicants based on preparedness, ability, aptitude, academic credentials, communication skills, and personal qualities such as motivation and integrity. These programs do not discriminate based on sex, race, age, religion, color, national origin, disability, or veteran status. We value diversity and aim to provide culturally compassionate care to our diverse populations.

**Additional Tips:** To remain competitive, applicants must have passing scores on STEP 1 or COMLEX 1 and are recommended to have scores of >220 on STEP 2 CK or >410 on COMLEX 2, with no failing scores on STEP 2 CK or COMLEX 2.







# Samaritan Health Services

Family Medicine Residency

## **Location:**

We are based in Corvallis Oregon, in the heart of the mid-Willamette Valley. We're an hour from the Cascade Mountains to the east and the Oregon coast to the west. Corvallis is a college town of about 59,000 and the home of Oregon State University. It's a city with a vibrant culture, great schools and a small-town feel. We enjoy a mild climate and hiking and biking trails are literally minutes away from the clinic.

## **About us:**

We prioritize community in all that we do! Through a rigorous and supportive learning environment, our family medicine residents are valued as colleagues and individual learners. We focus on training full-spectrum physicians who can be leaders in their communities and understand population health, run an inter-disciplinary team, all while providing excellent care to their patients.

## **How to apply:**

We aim to recruit and mentor residents who are curious, growth-minded, and motivated to serve as they develop the skills and knowledge required to care for diverse patients across the lifespan. All applications must come through ERAS. We consider applicants who have graduated within the past 3 years and may consider outstanding applicants who have graduated within the last 5 years with extenuating circumstances. Graduates of international medical schools must be eligible for licensure in Oregon. We are unable to sponsor visas.

## **Faculty expertise:**

The individual faculty at SFMRC have interests and expertise in a number of areas, including the following:

Osteopathy • Pregnancy care and women's health • Procedures • Rural medicine • Clinical informatics • Academic Medicine • Gender affirming care • Reproductive access • Inpatient medicine • Pain science and treatment • Diversity, equity, inclusion and justice • Wilderness medicine

## **Electives and rotations:**

Our curriculum emphasizes time in the continuity clinic caring for a panel of patients, with 16 weeks dedicated to clinic in PGY1, 8 weeks in PGY2, and 12 weeks in PGY3. PGY2 and PGY3 residents also have significant time in clinic during all outpatient rotations and electives. Inpatient medicine is done primarily on the Family Medicine Teaching Service team at Good Samaritan Regional Medical Center, with an additional rural inpatient medicine rotation at Samaritan North Lincoln Hospital. Additional core rotations include inpatient and outpatient pediatrics (8 weeks each), OB (12 weeks), adult ER, pediatric ER, outpatient general surgery, dermatology, inpatient cardiology, urgent care, hospice/palliative care, and 8 weeks of sports medicine. We have longitudinal experiences in geriatrics, community medicine, addiction medicine, behavioral health, scholarly activity, outpatient cardiology, gynecology, and Centering Pregnancy.

We have a wide choice of electives, including various medicine subspecialties, academic medicine, psychiatry, OMM, Student Health at OSU, psychiatry, bariatric medicine, and integrative medicine, to name a few. It's also an option to do additional focused time in any of the required curricular areas. We encourage residents to customize their electives to their future practice goals.

**Osteopathic identity:**

SHSFMR was founded as an Osteopathic, AOA-accredited program and has been ACGME-accredited since 2018. Osteopathic principles and practice, and whole person, patient-centered care, remain an important part of our identity. We offer an Area of Concentration in Osteopathy for residents who wish to expand and hone their skills. This includes OPP-focused didactics, scholarly activity, and OMM clinics at our office and elsewhere in the community, which are supervised by osteopathic faculty.

**Other info:**

We are affiliated with Samaritan Family Medicine Residency-Newport, a rural training program on the Oregon coast. The PGY1 residents for the Newport program spend their first year in Corvallis and transition to the coast for the remainder of their training.


We offer several Areas of Concentration for residents who want to focus on a particular aspect of Family Medicine. These include Osteopathy, Wilderness Medicine, and new in 2025, a resident championed AoC in LGBTQIA+ and Gender Affirming Care.

Many of our graduates now practice community-based primary care. Others are doing hospital medicine, full-spectrum rural medicine, or own their own practices. Graduates have also gone on to do fellowships in many areas, including Sports Medicine, OB, Geriatrics, Palliative Care, and Osteopathy Neuromuscular and Manipulative Medicine, to name a few.

**Location:**

We are a rural-track 1-2 program with year 1 spent in Corvallis, Oregon, at Good Samaritan Regional Medical Center, a level 2 trauma center. Residents then transition to Newport, Oregon, for years 2 and 3 and train unopposed at Pacific Communities Hospital, a critical-access hospital serving Lincoln County.

Corvallis, Oregon, is located in the beautiful Willamette Valley and is home to Oregon State University. With a population of 61,000, it offers a wide variety of activities and events.

Newport, Oregon, is located on the central Oregon coast, an hour away from Corvallis. It is known for its breathtaking scenery, miles of sandy beaches, stunning ocean views, and rich maritime history. The area offers easy access to numerous outdoor activities, including whale-watching, hiking, fishing, crabbing, and clamming. It is also the home of the Oregon Coast Aquarium, the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) west coast headquarters, and Hatfield Marine Science Center. With a population of around 10,000 residents, it is known for its small-town vibes and coastal charm.

**Our program:**

We offer immersive exposure to rural and underserved populations in adult and pediatric continuity care, inpatient, obstetrics, and behavioral health settings. The program structure provides both broad-spectrum family medicine skills and training to provide quality care with fewer specialty resources. Residents manage both outpatient and inpatient care and are often the primary contact for complex patients, developing high levels of autonomy and confidence.

**Application Process:**

We are seeking driven individuals who are passionate about caring for the rural and underserved and have a strong commitment to improving community health. Applicants need to be comfortable with the challenges of rural resource limitations and willing to be creative, flexible and solutions-focused.

We participate in the ERAS program and the NRMP match process. We consider applicants who have graduated within the past 3 years and may consider outstanding applicants who have graduated within the last 5 years with extenuating circumstances. Graduates of international medical schools must be eligible for licensure in Oregon. We are unable to sponsor visas.

**Curriculum overview:**

Year 1 training in Corvallis is spent with the PGY1 class of Samaritan Family Medicine Residency and includes foundational training with adult and pediatric inpatient rotations (10 and 8 weeks, respectively), outpatient pediatrics (4 weeks), obstetrics (4 weeks), and sports medicine (4 weeks), in addition to 16 weeks of continuity clinic rotations.

Years 2 and 3, residents enjoy longitudinal family medicine continuity clinic as well as longitudinal pediatric clinic. Emergency medicine rotations take place at our critical-access hospital in Newport and Providence Pediatric Emergency Room in Portland. Residents work with both family medicine and internal medicine hospitalists in an unopposed inpatient rotation for 12 weeks in 2nd year and 8 weeks in 3rd year. 12 weeks of rotations focus on care provided with Addiction Medicine, Lincoln County HHS, and the Confederated Tribe of Siletz Indians Community Health Clinic. Elective rotations include orthopedics, podiatry, wound care, hospice/palliative care, endocrinology, cardiology, and other subspecialties available.

Residents attend weekly didactic sessions (attending virtually with Corvallis program for PGY2 and PGY3) and are required to complete at least two QI or scholarly projects.

The program values resident wellness with features like quarterly wellness half-days, biannual retreats, Balint groups, and peer/faculty mentorship.

**Osteopathic association:**

Samaritan Health Services Corvallis-based Family Medicine Residency was founded as an osteopathic AOA-accredited program, and the rural training program has opportunities for engagement with osteopathic faculty, didactics, and scholarly activity.
